The DeKalb County Commission met in regular session on Tuesday January 10, 2023 at 10:00 a.m. in the DeKalb County Activities Building (Courthouse Annex). Those present were President Ricky Harcrow, Shane Wootten, Ron Saferite, and Lester Black. Absent was Terry Harris.

The meeting was called to order by President Harcrow with President Harcrow delivering the invocation, and Mr. Black leading the Pledge.

It was moved by Mr. Wootten, seconded by Mr. Saferite with all members voting affirmatively, motion carrying to dispense with the reading of the minutes and to accept them as presented in written format.

Road Department

<u>Update</u>—Mr. Broyles gave a brief update stating the Boom Mowers previously approved and purchased from state bid (Source Well), would be delivered in 12-15 weeks and three of the previously approved pick-ups and three crew trucks are ready with the remainder still about 3 months out. He also stated that last year a force feed loader was approved and ordered and expects delivery on that machine in May. Mr. Broyles also noted that crews are continuing to patch pot-holes in all districts.

Engineer

<u>Award Sheriff Truck Bid</u>--Mr. Luther stated that bids were opened on January 5, 2023 for the purchase of a 2022 Chevrolet Silverado (in stock) for Sheriff Welden. The bid was awarded to Donohoo Chevrolet who had the bid at \$60,000 (note: the truck was fully equipped with all law enforcement equipment, including lights/sirens, etc.).

Mr. Wootten made a motion to approve. Mr. Black seconded the motion. All members voting affirmatively, motion carried.

Award Integrated Tool Carrier (Boom Mower) Bid—Mr. Luther stated that bids were opened on January 5, 2023 for the purchase of two (2) Boom Mowers. Chambers American Products was the only bid received. The bid was \$176,550/each for a total of \$353,100 for two Boom Mowers. He also stated that Chambers would reduce the price by a total of \$10,000 if the County would let them take possession of the tractor that burned. The County would be able to keep the boom and one of the tires.

Section 1. The Contract and Exhibits attached thereto in substantially the same form as attached hereto as Exhibit "A" by and between the Seller and the Buyer is hereby approved and Matt G. Sharp, County Administrator (the "Authorized Officer") is hereby authorized and directed to execute said Contract on behalf of the Buyer.

Section 2. The Delivery Order is being issued in calendar year 2023.

Section 3. Neither any portion of the gross proceeds of the Contract nor the Equipment identified to the Contract shall be used (directly or indirectly) in a trade or business carried on by any person other than a governmental unit, except for such use as a member of the general public.

Section 4. No portion of the rental payment identified in the Contract (a) is secured, directly or indirectly, by property used or to be used in a trade or business carried on by a person other than a governmental unit, except for such use as a member of the general public, or by payments in respect of such property; or (b) is to be derived from payments (whether or not to Buyer) in respect of property or borrowed money used or to be used for a trade or business carried on by any person other than a governmental unit.

Section 5. No portion of the gross proceeds of the Contract are used (directly or indirectly) to make or finance loans to persons other than governmental units.

Section 6. The Authorized Officer is further authorized for and on behalf of the Governing Body and the Buyer to do all things necessary in furtherance of the obligations of the Buyer pursuant to the Contract, including execution and delivery of all other documents necessary or appropriate to carry out the transactions contemplated thereby in accordance with the terms and provisions thereof.

The aggregate face amount of all tax-exempt obligations (excluding private activity bonds other than qualified 501(c)(3) bonds) issued or to be used by the Buyer and all subordinate entities thereof during the current calendar year is not reasonably expected to exceed \$10,000,000. The Buyer and all subordinate entities thereof will not issue or enter into excess of \$10,000,000 of tax-exempt obligations (including the Contract, but excluding private activity bonds other than qualified 501 (c) (3) bonds) during the current calendar year, without first obtaining an opinion of nationally recognized counsel in the area of tax-exempt municipal obligations acceptable to the Seller that the designation of the Contract as a "qualified tax-exempt obligations" will not be adversely affected.

WHEREAS, during its 2012 Regular Session, the Alabama Legislature enacted Act No. 2012-256, effective April 26, 2012, which provides an exemption of the state sales and use tax for certain non-commercial purchases related to severe weather preparedness supplies during the first full weekend in July of 2012 and the last full weekend in February of each successive year; and

WHEREAS, Act No. 2012-256 authorizes the County Commission to provide for an exemption of county sales and use taxes for purchases of items covered by the Act during the same time period in which the state sales and use tax exemption is in place, provided a resolution to that effect is adopted at least thirty (30) days prior to the last full weekend in February; and

WHEREAS, the DeKalb County Commission has affirmatively voted to grant the exemption of county sales and use taxes on purchases covered by Act No. 2012-256 during the last full weekend of February 2023, beginning at 12:01 a.m. on February 24 and ending at twelve midnight on Sunday, February 26, 2023, the last full weekend of February in 2023; and

WHEREAS, <u>Code of Alabama 1975</u>, § 11-51-210(e) requires that the County Commission notify the Alabama Department of Revenue of any new local tax or amendment to an existing local tax levy at least thirty (30) days prior to the effective date of the change; and

WHEREAS, the exemption of certain county sales and use taxes for the last full weekend of February 2023 herein adopted by the County Commission is an amendment to the county's sales and use tax levy warranting notice to the Alabama Department of Revenue as provided in <u>Code of Alabama 197.5</u>, § 11-51-210(c);

WHEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE DEKALB COUNTY COMMISSION that it does hereby provide for an exemption of the County Sales and Use tax on purchases of items covered by Act No. 2012-256 beginning at 12:01 a.m. on February 24 and ending at twelve midnight on Sunday, February 26, 2023.
