WHEREAS, the DeKalb County Commission on the basis of an engineering and traffic investigation determines that the maximum speed permitted under Article 8, Title 32, Chapter 5A, Code of Alabama, 1975 for County Road 685 between County Road 116 and State Road 75 is greater than is reasonable and safe under the conditions found to exist on said paved road;

NOW THERFORE IT IS RESOLVED, that the proper maximum speed for County Road 685 between County Road 116 and State Road 75, outside of the Sylvania Town Limits, is set at 30 miles per hour at all times and no person shall operate a motor vehicle in excess of 30 miles per hour on said portions of County Road 685;

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, that any violations of this Resolution shall be unlawful and punishable pursuant to Title 32, Chapter 5A, Code of Alabama, 1975.

Award 2023 Tahoe Bid (Sheriff)—At the request of Mr. Luther, Mr. Sharp notified the Commission that Bids were opened on January 19, 2023 for three (3) Chevrolet Tahoes. The bid was awarded to Donohoo Cheverolet at a total cost of \$107,762.22.
