The DeKalb County Commission met in regular session on Tuesday August 8, 2023 at 10:00 a.m. in the DeKalb County Activities Building (Courthouse Annex). Those present were President Harcrow, Shane Wootten, Terry Harris, Ron Saferite, and Lester Black.

The meeting was called to order by President Harcrow with Mr. Ables, Mayor of Geraldine delivering the invocation, and Mr. Saferite leading the Pledge.

It was moved by Mr. Wootten seconded by Mr. Saferite with all members voting affirmatively, motion carrying to dispense with the reading of the minutes and to accept them as presented in written format.

Road Department

<u>Update</u>—Mr. Broyles updated the Commission stating all District crews are mowing. D2 crews are completing patchwork on the paving/resurfacing list. He stated that Mr. Watts, has been working on roads in D2 & D4 this past week and should be back soon to continue (weather permitting).

In D2, just west of Whiton, a bridge will need to be taken out and replaced. The plan is to do this before Fall weather. In addition, the pad has been poured for the D3 work crew building and the contractor is scheduled to begin work erecting the building next week.

<u>Equipment Surplus</u>—Mr. Broyles requested the Commission's approval to send the following pieces of surplus equipment to auction in September, CE1247 (2012 Cat backhoe). CE9882, CE9883 & CE9885 (1998 Motor graders). Also, included is a 2002 Rosco Broom Sweeper (CE0213).

Mr. Wootten made a motion to approve. Mr. Black seconded the motion. All members voting affirmatively, motion carried.

Engineer

<u>Kilpatrick Storm Shelter Bid</u>—Mr. Luther addressed the Commission stating bids were opened on July 19 for the sitework construction of the proposed Kilpatrick Storm Shelter. Lambert, Inc. presented the only bid. Mr. Luther made the recommendation to accept the bid and award the bid to Lambert, Inc. for the bid price of \$72,089.36 (The Grant will pay for about \$21,000 of this construction, with the remaining amount being funded through the SSUT Fund).

Mr. Saferite made the motion to accept the recommendation. Mr. Wootten seconded the motion. All members voting affirmatively to award the bid to Lambert, Inc.

<u>Road Dept. Trucks Bid</u>—Mr. Luther stated that bids were opened on August 3, 2023 for one or more 2024 Chevrolet Silverado Cab & Chassis work trucks. One bid was received from Donohoo Chevrolet in the amount of \$52,911.50. Mr. Luther made the recommendation to award the bid to Donohoo Chevrolet.

Mr. Harris made a motion to honor the request. Mr. Black seconded the motion. All members voting affirmatively, motion carried to award the bid to Donohoo Chevrolet.

<u>Road Dept Flat Bed Bodies Bid</u>—Mr. Luther stated that bids were opened on August 3, 2023 for one or more 9 ft Flat Beds to be mounted onto Silverado Cab & Chassis trucks. One bid was received from Knapheide for the bid price of \$7,065 per unit.

Mr. Wootten made a motion to accept the recommendation. Mr. Saferite seconded the motion. All members voting affirmatively, motion carried to award the bid Knaphide Truck Equipment.

<u>Traffic Stripe Proposals</u>—Mr. Luther presented two proposals for requested Traffic Striping on CR's 47, 57 and 92. J.C. Cheek Contractors presented a proposal for a total amount of \$19,925 and Ozark Striping Co. for a total amount of \$23,770. Mr. Luther made the recommendation to award the contract to J.C. Cheek Contractors.

Mr. Wootten made a motion to accept the recommendation. Mr. Harris seconded the motion. All members voting affirmatively, motion carried to aard projects as presented by Mr. Luther.

2) The County hereby conditionally allocates up to \$105,000 of its ARPA funds to cover part or all of the construction costs relating to an infrastructure project to install approximately 2,500 linear feet of 3" PVC water main along CR 485 and CR 659 on Sand Mountain to provide water to residents who do not have a safe, reliable potable water supply.

This allocation is conditioned upon meeting federal requirements as set forth in paragraph
 4 and further review of cost estimates of the project.

4) Following the successful completion of a risk assessment and development of a monitoring plan, the County is hereby directed to negotiate with the Northeast Alabama Water Sewer and Fire Protection District to establish a subaward agreement consistent with this resolution and the terms and conditions of the County's ARPA award.

WHEREAS, DeKalb County, Alabama, (the "County") has received American Rescue Plan Act State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds ("ARPA funds"); and WHEREAS, the Dekalb County Commission (the "Commission") is charged with ensuring that these funds are expended in accordance with state and federal law; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of the final rule published by the United States Department of Treasury dated January 6, 2022, the County has duly elected to designate a standard allowance of up to \$10,000,000 of its ARPA funds, not to exceed the County's total ARPA funds award, as revenue replacement ("ARPA revenue replacement funds"); and

WHEREAS, the County may use ARPA revenue replacement funds to facilitate the provision of government services and may use ARPA funds for necessary investments in water and sewer infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, the Northeast Alabama Water, Sewer, and Fire Protection District (the "District") is duly formed in accordance with the provisions Chapter 89 of Subtitle 3 of Title 11 of the Code of Alabama 1975; and

WHEREAS, Section 11-89-13 authorizes the County to provide funds to the District for the purpose of providing aiding the District in the construction and operation of water systems; and

WHEREAS, the District has applied to the Commission to receive ARPA funds to assist with the costs necessary to sandblast and repaint the interior and exterior of the existing water storage tank within the boundaries of the County on CR 449 near Mount Moriah Church; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has determined that providing funding to the District for these improvements is a reasonable, necessary, and eligible expenditure of ARPA revenue replacement funds

and that providing this funding will serve a public purpose by ensuring the consistent availability and efficient delivery of clean, safe water to County residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSION AS FOLLOWS:

1) The County hereby allocates up to \$165,000 of its ARPA revenue replacement funds to be used toward the cost of the water infrastructure project described herein (the "project").

 Distribution of these funds is conditioned upon the execution of a funding agreement between the District and the County setting forth the terms and conditions of the distribution and expenditure of these funds.

3) The President of the Commission is hereby authorized to execute such an agreement with the District on behalf of the Commission in a form substantially consistent with Attachment A to this Resolution. Thereafter, funds allocated in this Resolution may be distributed to the District in accordance with the terms of this Resolution and the executed agreement.

 ARPA revenue replacement funds provided to the District pursuant to this resolution shall not be expended for the following:

- a) To make deposits into a pension fund;
- b) To service debt or replenish rainy day funds;
- c) To satisfy settlements and judgments; or
- d) To fund programs, services, or capital expenditures that undermine efforts to stop the spread of COVID-19.

5) Distribution of the funds, as authorized by this Resolution, shall be contingent on the continued appropriation and availability of ARPA funds for the purposes described herein and in no event shall be used for any costs associated with the infrastructure projects described herein that are not obligated on or before December 31, 2024, and expended on or before December 31, 2026.

ARPA Status—Mr. Sharp addressed the Commission with a quarterly report of ARPA funds and stated that all monies must be expended by December 31, 2024 or the balance be paid back to the Federal Government.
